## **Near-Miss Fundamentals:**

There are several ways to submit a near-miss report. The easiest way is to submit the report on-line at <a href="www.firefighternearmiss.com">www.firefighternearmiss.com</a>. It takes about 15-20 minutes to complete the report. It is helpful to write the event description and lessons learned sections in a Word document and then copy and paste the sections into the reporting form. If you prefer not to submit a report on-line, you can print a blank reporting form on <a href="www.firefighternearmiss.com">www.firefighternearmiss.com</a>. After completing the form, you can scan it and send it to <a href="mailto:info@firefighternearmiss.com">info@firefighternearmiss.com</a>, fax it to 703-273-0920 or mail it to NMRS, 4025 Fair Ridge Dr., Fairfax VA 22033. The important thing is to take the time to submit a report to help another firefighter-EMT.
